Physician Assistant Alumnus Honored by Penn College

A 2008 graduate of Pennsylvania College of Technology's physician assistant major was honored with the college's <u>Alumni Achievement Award</u> at Summer 2017 commencement ceremonies, held Aug. 5 at the Community Arts Center, Williamsport. Kevin A. Hickman,

of Avon, Connecticut, and a Luzerne County native, received the award in recognition of his contributions to the physician assistant field and his alma mater. Hickman serves as director of Physician Assistant Services for Saint Francis Hospital and Medical Center, in Hartford, Connecticut. The medical center employs over 200 physician assistants and advanced practice registered nurses, and is part of Trinity Health Of New England, a regional health system serving Connecticut and western Massachusetts.

Two Penn College civil engineering graduates – David Wise, '92, and Maggie Jackson, '08 – are helping to lead the \$670 million Central Susquehanna Valley Transportation Project, one of the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation's largest undertakings. Wise is a construction manager for PennDOT, and Jackson is the design project engineer for the 13-mile limited access highway that will alleviate a problem faced for 40 years: congestion and heavy truck traffic through Shamokin Dam. The <u>Penn College Career Hub</u> is a powerful job search tool that allows students **and alumni** to connect with **thousands** of employers who are looking to hire you! Did you know.... that you have the ability to perform an Advanced Search which provides the ability to search by multiple criteria: location, major, position type, work authorization, etc. From Advanced Search you may create and save search agents. Search agents may be scheduled to run (daily, weekly, etc.) and send an automatic email to you listing the positions that meet your criteria. You can save multiple search agents!

To setup a search agent:

- Click on JOBS and click the Penn College Career Hub Jobs tab
- Select the drop down 'Advanced Search'
- To create a new search agent, select the criteria the search agent will be based on and click 'Search'. Your results will be displayed.

To save this search, click on 'Saved Searches' and type in a title of this search under 'Save search as...'. Under Send via email, you may choose how often you would like this search to run (i.e. daily, weekly, etc.). You may also choose for this search to send you new results only. Then, click 'Save'.

*** For an additional job search opportunity, Click on JOBS and click NACElink Extended Job Search. This will open up a new tab that contains hundreds of thousands more opportunities that can be filtered by 'Where' and 'What' (job title, keywords).

Electronic Transcripts Now Available

Penn College now offers the ability for our students and alumni to request electronic delivery of their transcript. We have partnered with Credentials Inc. to provide this service. Paper transcripts (transcripts that need to be mailed, faxed, or picked up from our office by the student) will continue to be available through the Registrar's Office, free of charge to our students and alumni.
