Established by the Williamsport School District, WTI developed many innovations in hands-on adult education



before becoming the third community college in the state in 1965 and later Penn College.



Online RN-to-BSN Degree Announced

There is a nationwide push for 80 percent of registered nurses to have their bachelor's degree by 2020. Pennsylvania College of Technology is helping to meet

that challenge with its <u>online BSN degree</u>, designed for the working nurse. Thanks to an eight-week class schedule, full-time BSN students can complete the program in a year. Penn College nursing alumni receive a 38-percent tuition discount when they enroll in the program, and out-of-state students pay the in-state tuition rate.
